

A year ago today, one week into Russia's invasion of Ukraine, Russian missiles fired at the Kyiv television tower, and Yevhenii Sakun became the first journalist to be killed while covering this war.

One year in, that number has climbed to at least 10.

Ukraine's media have been hit hard. Journalists have been forced to flee their homes, Russian rockets have targeted their offices and the critical infrastructure needed to do their work. In the face of these threats and dangers, journalists in Ukraine continue to cover the war and its atrocities.

We must stand with them.
